Ed Maxfield, NCC - spoke about the County Deal and the consultation via the website. Budgets were still being cut however they were trying to avoid decreasing front line services. NCC are endeavouring to achieve lower spending by restructuring and modernising the way they work. NCC spends the majority of its income on the older and young generations. There would be a 5% increase in council tax from NCC. Mobile libraries - the cuts are not as drastic as first thought; analysis took place on which areas are used and those which were not would be cut from the route.

# 6.4 NCC Parish Partnership Scheme - Installation of bollards Highways had now agreed to the utilisation of the solar bollard. They had also agreed to fund the road closure/street License (cost £1,750) for the installation of the bollards by Westcotec from Ed Maxfield's yearly funding pot. Progress would be monitored by the Clerk. EP

#### 6.5 Purchase of defibrillator

Two electricians had been contacted for quotations to install the unit and reminded however, they had not materialised. The Clerk had sourced an alternative unit which could be utilised at the location; it is battery operated and it may be a more appropriate solution. Further investigation would take place and be presented to the Council for a decision at the next meeting.
